Austin: China is hardening its position along LAC (Page no. 5)

China has continued to harden its positions along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) with India, US Defence Secretary Lloyd J Austin expressed alarm over Beijing's border infrastructure build-up.

He also flagged China's "destabilising" military activity near Taiwan and its aggressive approach to the territories it claims in the South China Sea, saying this threatens to undermine the stability of the Indo-Pacific region.

Speaking at the Shangri La Dialogue — a security conference organised by the International Institute of Strategic Studies in Singapore, in which top Chinese leaders are also present — Austin stated: "We are seeing Beijing continue to harden its position along the border that it shares with India."

Indian and Chinese troops have been locked in a border standoff in eastern Ladakh since May 5, 2020, when a violent clash between the two sides erupted in the Pangong lake area.

China has also been building bridges and constructing other infrastructure such as roads and residential units in the border areas with India.

Direct tax revenue trends are encouraging so far and the tax department is hoping to collect more than Budget estimates.
